On-farm Actions needed for New Rules

Properties > 40 ha effective area:

- will be allocated a Nitrogen Discharge Allowance (NDA)*
- will need to have applied for a Resource Consent by December 2017

To get a Resource Consent the land owner will need:

 a Nitrogen Management Plan (NMP) that shows progressive steps towards achieving the required Nitrogen Discharge Allowance (NDA) by 2032.

Smaller properties - 10 ha to 40 ha

- will not need a resource consent until 1 July 2022.
- Annual Report required from December 2017

Properties – 2 to 10 ha (Intensive)

- with intensive land use > ≈ 10kgN loss /ha/yr *
- will require resource consent by 2022.

Properties – 2 to 10 ha (non - intensive)

- Non intensive land use < ≈10kgN loss /ha/yr
- will require resource consent by 2022.

Properties - < 2 ha

Permitted - will not require a Resource Consent

Limitations Vs Opportunities

Limitations, few people love them:

- Speed limit 100km/hr?
- a 75km/hr speed limit?

Similarly - imposition of nitrogen limitations could impinge on:


- Your ability to earn a living from your land?
- Your ability to plan your / your families future progress?

BOPRC acknowledges this limitation will cause stress for many landowners.

BOPRC will help:

- - Make available best expertise
 - Help develop new opportunities





- **270T ↓** less **N**
- 140T ↓ by regulation off pastoral sector operations
- **Effect on Landowners minor to ≈ 50%**



First Questions

Regulation for N-loss reductions – first responses from most land owners include:

- What is my current N-loss?
- Where do I have to get to? (=NDA)
- What nitrogen-loss reduction options are possible for my farm?
- What impacts will reductions in nitrogenloss have on my farming business?
- Can the required N target be achieved and the farm remain viable?



BOPRC recognizes that:

- Coming to grips with 'Catchment Limits' on nutrients for water quality objectives is a difficult process
- Not easy to see what workable options there may be for your farming operation and the impacts on your future business
- Pressure is on > 40ha properties need a Resource Consent application in 2 years time

The recognition of this difficulty and stress has resulted in BOPRC offering a suite of support specifically for catchment farmers that is available now

The Advice and Support Service is:


- a free service

- access to a wide range of professional expertise.




Advice and Support Service:

- delivers the property's "provisional" Nutrient Discharge Allowance* (pNDA)
- establishes the current nitrogen-loss status
- facilitates development of Nitrogen Management Plan (NMP) via free independent Land Use Advisors
- NMP shows how a landowner intends to meet his Nitrogen Discharge Allowance
- the property NMP is a requirement for applying for a Resource Consent

Progress to date

- ~ 30 farmers have registered interest in A & S.
- ~ 12 Nitrogen Discharge Assessment Reports are currently being drafted for farmers
- The mechanism for how the N-limits will be allocated to various land use types is still to be finalised.
- The Stakeholder Advisory Group is working with Council on the N-allocation mechanism for rules.
- Current thinking is an NDA allocation system with:
 - a range for dry stock and a range for dairy
 - tree and house block allocations
