STAG Follow Up

Item 1: \$5.5m What's next?

1. Covered in STAG Meeting - Incentives team to collate answers received.

Item 2: Farm Nutrient Plans

- 1. What are the likely rule requirements? Should they link with existing farm plan templates?
 - a. Overseer nutrient budgets effectively form part of the current Rule 11 requirements FNPs will be more comprehensive.
 - Council is working with industry to develop FNP templates, including the "Dashboard" being developed BOPRC, Dairy NZ and Beef & Lamb NZ – this provides a set of KPIs and progress tracking.
- 2. DNZ's Sustainable Milk Plan (SMP) is a basic plan with 5 target areas, including "nutrients".
 - a. Capable of managing some reduction but not designed to meet NDAs more to chart a direction of travel, ID mitigation opportunities. Not farm systems change.
 - b. Dashboard will get everyone on the same baseline
 - c. DNZ SMP roll out for Rotorua by early-mid 2015, with minimal requirements as rules and incentives not available yet. Noting: SMPs national while FNPs will be needed to deliver the NDA; SNP can be modified for Lake Rotorua; Time length of plan needs to be decided; Alternative is to start FNP design from scratch.
- 3. Commonality needed with drystock and dairy FNPs.
 - a. Establish a technical subgroup to help direct content

b. Assuming FNPs required for consent, work backwards from there, noting: Farmers want consents to at least 2032 – does this depend on showing "managed reduction"?; The policy needs a disincentive on waiting till 2032 to make changes.

ACTION: pull together a working group - 1st task is define FNP requirements

Item 3: Land TAG

Regional/lakes focus options – accepted that it will initially focus on lake catchments, then morph to a region-wide, noting: Consider regional funding / rating base issue; Reporting line – Council if region-wide; Also possible to report to CEO and inform RTASLG and Council as appropriate.

ACTION: Simon to draft ToR, focusing on lakes initially, with transition to a regional TAG. Draft to be presented at next StAG subcommittee 26 March 2014.

Item 4: Grow Rotorua

Grow Rotorua liaison and interaction with Lakes Programme discussed.

ACTION: Tanira Kingi to talk to Francis Pauwels and John Green

Item 6: NDA Alternatives

Some people are looking at the possibility of a single pastoral sector, so:

- 1. What would that look like based on Rule 11 data? Average from R11 data is about 20kgN/ha/yr
- 2. Takes away the dairy/drystock clash, appears to be more fair
- 3. Will be informed by NDA analysis and catchment modelling work

ACTION: Add this to the scope of the NDA Phase II catchment analysis (Ollie Parsons)

ACTION: Add to agenda for next subcom: present spreadsheet on single pasture sector (Warren Webber)

Item 7: NDA impact analysis

- 1. Perrin Ag granted contract, project underway
- 2. Scope may expand to give additional "below NDA" scenarios to assist later catchment modelling.
- 3. This "Phase 1" will give a picture of individual farm impacts.

Item 7: Overseer

- 1. Converting version 5 to 6 Progressing steadily, Headlands received contract
- 2. Calibration/validation- Lake Rotorua calibration needs to fit into a national initiative, noting:
 - a. Very costly for BOPRC and will benefit NZ and other regional councils.
- 3. Overseer Rules report final draft with Sarah Omundsen
- 4. ROTAN link to Overseer will assess calibration need after 5-6 Overseer migration.
