

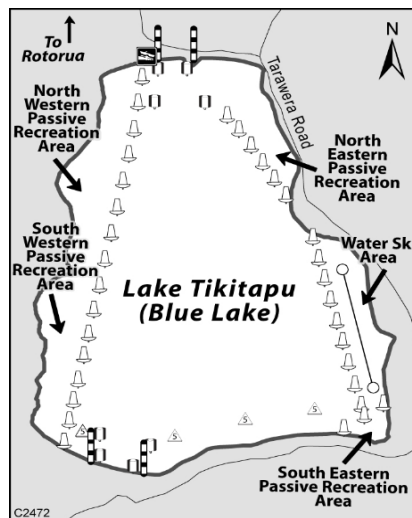
## Notice of Partial and Full Lake Closures Lake Tikitapu (Blue Lake)

The public is hereby advised that pursuant to Bay of Plenty Regional Navigation Safety Bylaw 2017, **Lake Tikitapu will be both partially and fully closed**, as detailed below, on **Saturday 29 and Sunday 30 January 2022**. This is to permit Rotorua Association of Triathletes and Multisport to host the below as part of the Blue Lake Multisport Festival 2021.

**Saturday 29 January 2022: Times include set up/pack down**  
**Aquathon 0630 - 1000 hrs. PARTIAL LAKE CLOSURE**  
of the North Western Passive Recreation Area only. The rest of the lake is open and available for all other lake users

**Open Water Swim 1400 - 1900 hrs. FULL LAKE CLOSURE**  
The North Eastern / South Western Passive Recreation Areas of the lake will remain available for passive use only.

**Sunday 30 January 2022: Times include set up/pack down**  
**Taster and Sprint Tri 0600 - 1030 hrs. FULL LAKE CLOSURE**  
The Water Ski and all Southern Passive Recreation Areas of the lake will remain available for passive use only.
