1. Rules Programme

Sarah outlined the pre-circulated 2-page table summary. Key points:

- A busy schedule focused on getting draft RMA rules to Council March 2014
- Multiple windows for StAG input, open to more opportunities as needed
- StAG input to be sought on 22 October

Current consultant "rules" work includes:

- Review of other regional council rule activity status (permitted, controlled etc)
- Use of Overseer in RMA rules expert panel due 15 November, Simon coordinating
- Nutrient trading, building on earlier Motu work
- Properties < 40ha, effectively complete, useful data and qualitative lessons

2. Sector definitions, dairy support, sector ranges

Draft definition paper (as pre-circulated) – discussion points:

 Dairy and drystock definitions accepted, consistent with ROTAN e.g. NDA 35kgN/ha/yr applies only to milking platform Base year definition important, an issue needed attention at 22 October StAG

Draft dairy support NDA options (covering about 2500 ha):

- i. status quo dairy and drystock sectors (no dairy support sector)
- ii. dairy support NDA @ 18 with dairy @ 35, drystock @ 12 (i.e. reduced from 13 to accommodate dairy support)
- iii. additional 3kgN/ha/yr linked to the actual dairy stock i.e. the allowance moves with the stock to support blocks, while maintaining the "two sector" approach
 - provision for dairy support links to economic importance (both dairy and drystock)
 and wider equity
 - Reducing drystock NDA to 12 (average) is challenging, but can be partly balanced by the incentives scheme opportunities
 - Seek StAG feedback, pros and cons i.e. information gathering, not a "decision" yet

Sector ranges –this adds complexity, difficult to resolve given the advantage of being at the upper end of any defined range. Can industry sectors advise a logical range rationale?

Action: Simon to ask DairyNZ and Beef & Lamb NZ for advice on range rationale

3. Incentives programme

- Revised incentives programme pre-circulated, amended since last StAG
- Workshop on incentives fund governance mid-November, date to be confirmed a report by APR will help inform this workshop. Focus is to identify critical success factors to drive incentives scheme
- Short term funding specifics needed for BORPC Annual Plan and Govt Deed

4. Gorse project

- Project to be led by BOPRC land management team, internal delivery using BOPRC funds - note 30 tN cost estimate rise due to many small gorse stands with poor economies of scale
- Alternatives to pines OK (reversion, multiple tree crops) but incentive amount linked to lowest cost option
- BOPRC staff experts to present to StAG, although funding Main discussion points, resolutions and actions to be recorded in a manner which accurately reflects meeting content

5. General business

The wider science programme and communication to stakeholders

- Farmers have bought into rules and incentives work programme but still want more timely information on the Water TAG science programme e.g. explaining recent TLI improvement, alum impact etc
- Raise at next StAG, with separate follow-up later given busy StAG schedule
