- b. Small block owner needs are very different, therefore message needs to be different.

 - This review could also look at N impacts from Alum dosing

 - Most work for any science review is current and ongoing
 - Lake modelling report is being updated by University of Waikato with peer review by WQTAG
 - WQTAG discussion on the need for an official WQTAG statement on N & P.
 - Land TAG members identified, confirmation underway, first meeting early October
